



### Ingredients

Bananas

A square wrap

A small portion of butter

Chocolate chips


\*Plus anything else you want – Orios, marshmallows, cinnamon, strawberries



While this is not an authentic sushi dish, it is a delicious dessert option.

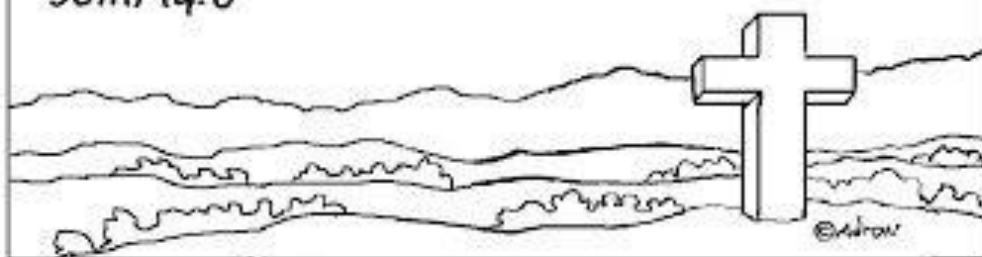
1. Cut your banana into chunks (any size will do) and lay them down the middle of the wrap.
2. Sprinkle chocolate chips the entire length of the banana. You can add anything you like – delicious fruit, sickly sweet treats ... whatever is in the house.
3. Smear butter along the edge of the wrap so it will stick together (you could melt the butter if you want. Ask an adult to help you with this).
4. Roll the banana chunks, using the buttered edge to stick it together.
5. Pour chocolate chips into a mug and melt them in the microwave, stirring every 10 seconds. This might take 30-60 seconds to complete.
6. Chop your banana wrap into bite-size pieces and dip them in the melted chocolate for extra yumminess. Share them with your parents or siblings and enjoy!

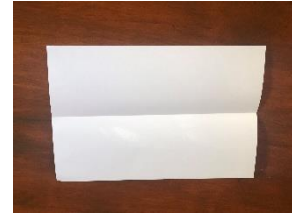

## How to Make an Origami Book

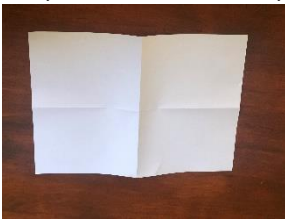
### What You'll Need:

Blank Paper – you can use any colour  
Scissors  
Card to make the cover  
Glue stick  
Things to draw and decorate your book



### What to Do:

Step 1: Take a blank piece of paper and fold it in half length-wise so it makes a long, skinny rectangle. Open the paper back up.

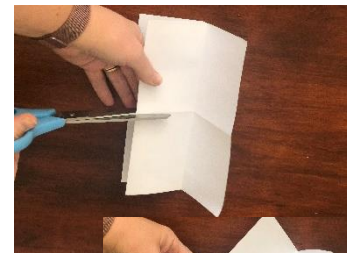


Step 2: Fold the paper in half width-wise so it makes a short, fat rectangle. Unfold and turn your page over.

Step 3: Fold both ends into the middle so that when unfolded it looks like a W or M.



Step 4: Use scissors to cut along the centre crease, stopping at the valley of the W.



Step 5: Fold the paper in half, following the previously made creases.



Step 6: Bring the sides together to form a booklet.



Step 7: To make the cover, lay the book open on the back side of a sheet of scrapbook paper or cardstock. Trace the outline of your book.



Step 8: Cut out your cover and fold it in half. Run a small amount of glue around the inside edge of the cover and slide the booklet inside. You may need to press the finished book under something heavy (like another book) for a few minutes.



All done! Decorate your book with stickers and drawings. Draw pictures of the stories you have heard this week, including Joseph and his brothers, Moses and Miriam and Andrew and Simon. Keep adding stories as the week goes on.

Want a book with more pages? Make multiple booklets by following steps 1-6, glue the booklets together, and then add your cover. Just make sure your cover is big enough to hold all your pages.

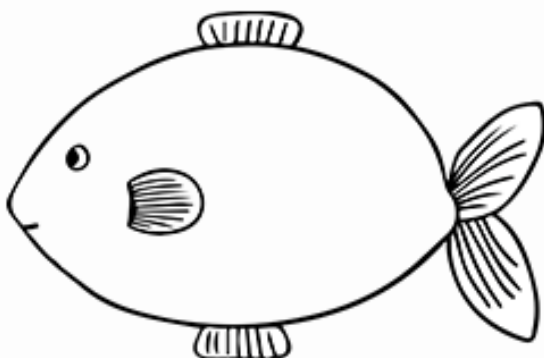
